

# ApHC UK PERFORMANCE RECORD

## Conditions of Entry:

In order to assess the performance of stallions, mares and their progeny the ApHC UK have compiled a system to record the success of horses similar with the national points system of ApHC USA. The points by a horse will be retained with the horse in case of sale or lease.

Use one page per horse if a number of horses entered at the same show. Stallions must hold an ApHC UK Stallion Licence.

In order to earn any points/awards the owner/exhibitor must be a current ApHC UK member in good standing and the horse must be ApHC UK registered (main or part-bred). If a horse is jointly owned, one owner must be a member in good standing. In order for the horse to receive points for year end awards, the point year for the HI POINT runs from 1<sup>st</sup> November through to 31<sup>st</sup> October each year. Point earning will start each 1<sup>st</sup> November.

Points for ROM awards will be accumulative over each year (i.e. a running total).

The horse can enter any class at any show - in-hand/halter (excluding WES showmanship) or ridden (whether it be an English or Western discipline) but it MUST be the same combination throughout.

ALL RECORD SHEETS MUST be signed by the Show Secretary on the day.

Any horse entered at any show shall earn points towards the National Point System. DOUBLE points will be awarded at any ApHC UK approved show i.e. Regional or National Shows.

Points earned shall be in accordance to the number of horses shown and judged in a class as follows. Simply entering a class does not merit awarding of points.

Championships shall be awarded extra points as follows:  
 Reserve Champion – 0.5, Champion – 1 point, Supreme – 2 points (whether in-hand or ridden)  
 Endurance rides – Bronze 2 points, Silver 3 points, Gold 4 points  
 TREC events:

It is up to the owner/exhibitor to ensure that all entries submitted to the ApHC UK are accurate and honest and have been signed by the show secretary on the day. Any entry found to be fraudulent will mean automatic removal of the horse from the ApHC UK register and immediate removal of membership for the owner/exhibitor. All details of entries must be correctly completed and signed and sent to the ApHC UK by 1<sup>st</sup> November of each year in order to be considered for any awards.

Horses are awarded the Register of Merit (ROM) when they have earned at least 10 points in each specific category e.g. ROM Halter, ROM Most Colourful, ROM Western Pleasure, ROM Dressage, ROM English Ridden etc. Horses can then be advertised/promoted showing their ROM achievements.

A certificate/trophy for ApHC UK Champion will be awarded when a horse has earned 50 points, provided that at least 25 of the points have been earned in halter and at least 25 points have been earned in at least three different performance disciplines.

A certificate/trophy as ApHC UK Supreme Champion Horse will be awarded when a horse has earned at least 100 pints, with a least 40 pints earned in halter classes and at least 60 points earned in performance classes.

A certificate/trophy for ApHC UK Versatility Champion will be awarded when a horse has earned five ROM's, only one of which will be a halter ROM.

The following classes are the only approved classes for Register of Merit placings:

Halter Classes – any Appaloosa halter class whether divided by age/sex  
Any open hack/light horse/hunter type class  
Most colourful (open or Appaloosa)

Performance Classes – show jumping, dressage, eventing, endurance, Le Trec, driving, western pleasure, western riding, trail, reining (novice or open horse categories only)  
Any ridden showing or working hunter

NO POINTS will be awarded where it is the rider/handler being judged and not the horse e.g. turn out, best condition, showmanship, horsemanship, equitation etc.

The ApHC UK reserves the right to amend any of the above to ensure that the system runs effectively and fairly for all its members and their horses.
